- 1. The Add- on course I undertaken in 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21 have immensely helped the students and they have individually or jointly with their classmates have prepared and presented several research papers at the state and national levels in a number of academic institutions in and around Kolkata. - 3. Definitely learning the process handling different type of data sources using software would enhance their capability in this regard, for which another Add-on course might be in the offing. But the comprehensive approach towards writing a dissertation would remain the first basic step towards the fuller treatment undertaken later in this regard.
- 4. Finally, the basic purpose of any add-on course as per the UGC guideline is to cater for increasing employability of the present students in near future. We firmly believe that the proposed Add-on course would stand in good stead for the students in this regard

Rationale behind taking up the above mentioned add on course for the Semester 3 Honours students stems from the following:

- 1. The **Add** -on course I undertaken since 2018-19 have immensely helped the students and they have already individually or jointly with their classmates have prepared and presented several research papers add the state and national levels in a number of academic institutions in and around Kolkata. But as mentioned earlier, now they should learn how to handle data using software. Only then they would be able to do justice do their research work.
- To be more precise, extracting and applying National Sample Survey Data and National Family Health Survey data both at unit -level would help them deal with data at the desired level of disaggregation and would enable them pursuing further refined research work using statistical and econometric analysis using STATA or any other similar software.
- 3. The aspect of employability of an Honours student with the knowledge of consecutive two add-on courses would definitely be much greater compared to an Honours student devoid of such knowledge in this case.
- 4. It is thus the prerequisite of our college in general and the department in particular to offer all the Honours students, already equipped with the capability of writing good research papers, another Add-on course on handling unit level data of NSS and NFHS and broaden further new openings in the job market for them in near future.

Add-on Course titled "Empirical Research in Economics III: Exploring ICDS, NFHS, NSS and DISE Reports and Basics of Unit Level NFHS and NSS Data (for Education)-Focus on Basic Health Care and Educational attainment in India"

Rationale behind taking up the above-mentioned Add-on Course stems from the following reasons:

- As discussed in the rationale behind taking up Add-on II in 2020-21, after exploring Population Census and NSS Reports to analyse the Economic sector in India, it seems quite worthwhile to explore next the ICDS, NFHS and DISE Reports to analyse the Social sector.
- To be more precise, the ICDS (Integrated Child Development Scheme) and NFHS (National Family Health Survey) Reports would be explored to understand the Health status in India.
- 3. DISE (District Information in School education) Reports would be explored to assess the status of primary education in India.
- 4. Comprehending the Social sector Reports in India is expected to refine the analytical base of a research scholar, already equipped with the capability of understanding the Economic sector, further and enrich the analytical skill of the UG students in their future research work at higher levels of academic endeavour.
- 5. For further in-depth study regarding health and education in India the Add-on course III from this year includes understanding the basics of unit level NFHS-5 data for 2021-22 and basics of NSS data for 2011-12 respectively. This would help the students carry out the research work for both health and education at their desired levels of disaggregation. In future we wish to offer students extraction and application of both NFHS and NSS unit level data in detail. Till then understanding the basics of such data along with the NSS Reports (and Census Reports) would obviously enhance their skill for carrying out further academic research in future.
