The Brahmi Script is the earliest writing system developed in India after the Indus script. It is one of the most influential writing systems; all modern India scripts and several scripts found in Southeast and East Asia are derived from Brahmi. It is also found in Northern and Central India and represents the Prakrit and Pali languages. The Ashokan Inscriptions already show some slight regional variations of the Brahmi script.

The Brahmi Script is the earliest writing system developed in India after the Indus script. It is one of the most influential writing systems; all modern India scripts and several scripts found in Southeast and East Asia are derived from Brahmi. It is also found in Northern and Central India and represents the Prakrit and Pali languages. The Ashokan Inscriptions already show some slight regional variations of the Brahmi script.
