About the College:

Vivekananda College prides itself on maintaining a ragging-free, environmentally conscious campus, ensuring a pollution-free, smoke-free, and plastic-free atmosphere. With a well-organized and systematic building infrastructure, the college boasts spacious, well-ventilated, and comfortable classrooms, reflecting its commitment to providing a conducive learning environment. The campus itself encompasses all necessary standards and amenities for exceptional educational infrastructure, with ongoing efforts to upgrade and enhance existing facilities.

General Observations:

- Vivekananda College, Thakurpukur is affiliated to the University of Calcutta, Kolkata and aided by Govt. of West Bengal.
- The college has been accredited by NAAC under the second cycle with a CGPA of 3.06, earning a grade of A. The college has received accreditation from NAAC in its first cycle with an institutional score of 80.10, achieving a grade of B++.
- Progressive vision of the Management & Principal with a definite plan of action following a decentralized and participative administrative network.
- Dedicated faculty members, comprising a blend of seasoned professionals and recently appointed individuals, demonstrate both qualification and commitment.
- The College is RUSA funded and receives other state government fundings.
- Departments operate in accordance with the institutional quality policies.

- Substantive Faculty members -76 [71(Faculty)+1(Principal) +2(Librarian)+2(GLI)], SACT-41, Administrative staff- 17; Casual Supporting Staff-38

- The College is resorting to a green campus concept.
- Both male and female security personnel have been appointed.
- An inclusive system of Management was observed.
- Office registers are up to date.
- 1 auditorium, 1 open air stage and 1 AC seminar hall (120 seat capacity) with audio visual facilities.
- Teacher's room, students' union room, academic office rooms and some research laboratories provided with air conditioners.
- The college offers a range of modern, state-of-the-art infrastructure to support student learning, including:
 - Well-illuminated and ventilated classrooms
 - Well-equipped laboratories
 - A central library housing approximately 45,000 books, supplemented by departmental libraries
 - LAN/Wi-Fi facilities across all building blocks, with 28% of classrooms equipped with audio visual and ICT facilities and internet connectivity
 - Departmental seminar rooms in science departments connected via LAN, with LAN connectivity available in strategic locations within Arts departments.
 - Three ICT-equipped classrooms/seminar halls for lectures and presentations.
 - A dedicated computer center with 33 terminals and internet connectivity for student and staff use.
 - Additionally, the college hosts a computer center operated by a third party under DOECC affiliation.

Academic performance of each individual teacher comes under serious scrutiny by IQAC and recommended to the Governing Body for approval and finally forwarded to the DPI, Govt. of West Bengal.

The institution provides a range of material benefits including Wi-Fi facilities, office rooms, parking facilities, clean drinking water, bank and ATM facilities, and infrastructural support in laboratories for research activities.

Basic amenities like water purifiers, refrigerators, microwaves, and photocopying facilities are provided for the convenience of faculty members.

The smooth functioning of the college is ensured by decentralization and participatory management. The Principal serves as the head of the institution and delegates responsibilities to various committees for academic matters such as the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) for teaching-learning improvement. The Governing Body is the highest decision-making body for college administration. It is comprised of teaching and non-teaching members, university and government nominees and student representative. Governing Body, Principal, Teachers' Council and IQAC are always working in tandem for designing and implementing quality control policy. Several Statutory Committees are constituted by Governing Body for

efficient management of governance.

- The Teachers' Council, led by the Principal as Chairperson and an elected/selected teacher as Secretary, discusses academic issues, with each faculty member serving on different sub-committees. These committees, under the leadership of respective coordinators, ensure activities are conducted effectively. Sub-committees like the Admission and Academic Sub-Committees oversees admission and academic procedures, and Academic Sub-Committee also coordinates timetable preparation with each department.
- The Library Sub-Committee is responsible for library facilities and maintenance.
- Student office bearers organize events like the Annual Social, Fresher's welcome, and Saraswati Puja, while the Sports Committee, in collaboration with student office bearers, arranges events like the Annual Sports, cricket, and football tournaments. The college football team, formed by the Sports Committee, participates in various tournaments. All administrative bodies include faculty representation.

Besides these other Gender Equity Measures in College are

Security personnel ensuring gender equality: The college employs 6 security personnel, consisting of 5 males and 1 female staff member, ensuring a balanced representation of genders in security roles.

Controlled Entry and Visitor Registration: Entry to the campus is permitted only with a college ID, and a register is maintained for visitors, enhancing safety and security measures.

Comprehensive CCTV Coverage: The entire campus is equipped with 40 IP CCTV cameras in outdoor areas, ensuring surveillance and security for all students, faculty, and staff.

Accessibility to Mentors and HODs: Students feel connected to their mentors and Heads of Departments (HODs), who make themselves available for counselling needs whenever required. Additionally, the Principal is approachable for any concern or guidance.

Internal Complaint Committee (ICC): An ICC is established to investigate any complaints of sexual harassment from students or teaching/non-teaching staff,

providing a safe and supportive environment for reporting and addressing such issues.

Female-Friendly Facilities: The college prioritizes the comfort and well-being of female students by providing amenities such as a Girls' Common Room with washrooms, water coolers, and a sanitary napkin dispenser.

Accommodation Support: Recognizing the needs of female students coming from distant places, the college has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with a PG accommodation facility called Chhatrinibas, ensuring safe and suitable accommodation options.

Establishment of Women's Cell: In compliance with university directives, the college has established a Women's Cell to address issues related to gender equality and women's empowerment. This proactive committee works to prevent sexual harassment, promote well-being, and foster a gender-sensitive environment on campus.

Support for Government Programs: The Scholarship Cell assists female students with the application process for government programs such as the "Kanyashree Prokalpa," which supports the education and empowerment of girls.

- Additionally, with heartfelt support and inspiration from various contributors of the Teachers' Council, a donation of Rs. 81,000 was made to the family members of **Late Sankar Mondal**, our casual non-teaching staff, on 23rd February 2022.
- Vivekananda College maintains a cherished connection with its retired faculty members through the Vivekananda College Retired Teachers' Organization, '**Bhushundir Mathe**'. This organization, named after a short story written by the renowned author Parashuram, hosts an annual reunion where former colleagues reunite to reminisce about their shared experiences, both in and outside the classrooms. 




Graphical Representation of data

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

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RECOMMENDATIONS

- Student internships/projects is recommended to be made mandatory for all students.
- New generation courses should be included to cater to the need of students.
- All the vacant teaching posts should be filled up.
- Importance should be given to develop e-content and online resources.
- More Faculty members should be encouraged to secure PhD.
- Continuous evaluation pattern in all departments should be strengthened. The assessment approach in the form of ongoing assessment of students' learning progress throughout the academic term or year, rather than relying solely on one final University examination
- Question banks can be set up for each department and updated annually.
- Outcome-Based Education (OBE) should be encouraged more.
- Research output and number and quality of publications should be improved and collaborative initiatives should be developed. Encourage faculty to take up more of funded projects. Area specific and socially relevant research projects should be undertaken.
- Academy and industry linkages for research and education should be promoted.

- Library infrastructure and reading facilities for students may be enhanced. More departmental libraries should be introduced.
- It is recommended to go for ISO certification as an additional quality assurance measure.
- Additional skill enhancement programs should be introduced progressively.
- Efforts should be made to increase student enrolment and admissions in specific subjects to ensure that the total intake capacity is filled up.
- Certificate, diploma courses in vocational streams, and short-term courses ought to be introduced within the college.

Conclusion: Overall the Academic Audit highlights not only the college's commitment to provide quality education and fostering an environment for student development but also its commitment to excellence, sustainability, and inclusivity in higher education.
