PREFACE

Gender equity involves ensuring fair treatment and behavior towards individuals, regardless of gender, while considering their specific needs. On the other hand, gender equality addresses broader issues, encompassing discussions on women's emancipation and empowerment. With heightened awareness of gender issues, women are increasingly taking spontaneous action against the oppression and exploitation they face. Gender awareness empowers women to challenge traditional stereotypes and rigid gender roles. To enhance the safety of women on college campuses, a gender audit was conducted. This process involved selecting audit sites, choosing participants, providing orientation, conducting walkabouts, documenting findings, and sharing recommendations with the college principal for implementation.

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Introduction

Vivekananda College stands as a beacon of educational excellence in the south western fringe of Kolkata, dedicated to imparting value-based and principled education to the youth of our vast community. Our college is blessed with a team of experienced, knowledgeable, and dynamic teachers who nurture and guide our students towards success.

Originally established as Barisha College in 1950 under the Dispersal Scheme of the State Government, Vivekananda College was created to alleviate the pressure on colleges in the Calcutta Metropolis due to the influx of people from East Pakistan (now Bangladesh). Initially housed in Barisha High School, it relocated to its own premises near the school compound in 1953, operating as an Intermediate College.

In June 1956, the State Government sponsored Vivekananda College's upgrade to a degree college, and it was also included in the Refugee Education Scheme of the Ministry of Rehabilitation, Government of India. It was during this time that the college was renamed Vivekananda College in honor of Swami Vivekananda, the revered patriot and social reformer who played a pivotal role in shaping modern India.

Due to growing student numbers, the college faced space constraints, leading to a relocation to a larger campus in Thakurpukur in 1959. The original Barisha College building was repurposed as the Women's Section, eventually becoming Vivekananda College for Women in 1961.

The college is affiliated to the University of Calcutta, Kolkata and aided by Govt. of West Bengal. And is recognized by the University, and is recognized by Grants Commission under Section 2(f) and 12[B] and also Re-accredited by the National Accreditation and Assessment Council (NAAC), Bangalore.

Today, Vivekananda College accommodates approximately 5000 students, 110 teachers, and around 60 non-teaching staff members. The college operates in two shifts – Day and Morning – and is open to both male and female students. Currently, we offer a wide range of courses including M. A, M.Sc. in 4 subjects, and undergraduate programs across 20 subjects, all operating at full capacity. In addition to regular classes, we organize seminars, workshops, and competitions in collaboration with renowned institutes and NGOs, covering diverse topics such as social issues, politics, science, technology, and environmental awareness. Cultural and sports events are also an integral part of our academic calendar, ensuring holistic development of our students.

The college library boasts an extensive collection of books and offers a conducive environment for study and research. Educational tours organized by various departments expose students to different parts of India and West Bengal, enriching their understanding of our multi-lingual and

In addition to conventional teaching, more stress is laid on imbibing moral and ethical characters, career planning and guidance, sports and co-curricular activities.

At Vivekananda College, we prioritize inclusivity, catering to students from all sections of society, especially those from socially and economically disadvantaged backgrounds, and minority communities. Every student is given special attention and support to ensure their holistic development and success.

The college has implemented **Specific Initiatives** to enhance the environment for women, such as the recruitment of women security guards, MOU with two female hostels, sanitary napkin vending machine and the augmentation of ladies' restroom facilities. Additionally, the college has established various cells to safeguard the interests of students and staff, irrespective of gender and the details of the cells are given below-

1) INTERNAL COMPLAINT CELL

The College has established an Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) in compliance with the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act and Rule 2013. In line with the heightened standards of responsibility and accountability set forth in the Vishaka Guidelines, the Supreme Court has mandated workplaces and institutions, along with individuals in positions of authority, to uphold the fundamental rights of working women to equality and dignity in the workplace. To meet this standard, institutions are obligated to fulfill three key responsibilities: Prohibition, Prevention, and Redressal. This cell ensures the safety, dignity, and rights of all students, faculty, and staff, with a specific focus on addressing issues related to gender-based harassment and discrimination. ICC provides a supportive and confidential mechanism for reporting and addressing complaints of gender-based harassment or discrimination.

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2) WOMEN'S CELL

3) SOCIAL EQUALITY CELL

As per the University Grant Commission (UGC) guidelines, this cell was established to support students from reserved category, to provide sessions and guidance to disadvantaged group, to discuss caste, reservation, our problems in the campus without fear. It also addresses the issues related to staff & students belonging to Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe, Other Backward Caste, minorities and Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) on a continual basis.

The Social Equity cell has implemented various initiatives to support students from marginalized communities.

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4) TRAINING AND JOB PLACEMENT CELL

The Training and Placement Cell operates round the year to facilitate contacts between companies and students. The goal of Training & Placement Cell is to provide students with a platform for using their potential to gain valuable experience by working in industry, it also acts as the interface between various companies seeking talented young graduates and post graduates in various disciplines.

The training and job placement cell ensures equal opportunities for all students, regardless of gender, to apply for various job offers.

5) ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL

Entrepreneurship Development Cell [EDC] was established to assist students, entrepreneurs, with pre-venture, start-up or existing business with financial management, marketing, technology and product development and commercialization issues.

The Entrepreneurship development cell has focused on bringing a perceptual change to opt for entrepreneurship as a self-employment opportunity irrespective of male and female students. 'PROCHESTA' is one of the unique concepts of this cell which has helped in promoting entrepreneurship by promoting the concept of 'earning while learning' by the students. EDC encourages equal participation of male and female students in entrepreneurship-related activities such as workshops, seminars, and art and craft fair. These fairs not only provide a platform for students to display their skills but also offer opportunities for them to earn income from their creations.

6) Scholarship Cell

The Scholarship Cell in degree colleges aims to facilitate access to financial aid and support for deserving students, ensuring that financial constraints do not hinder their educational pursuits. The cell helps in disseminating information about various scholarships, grants, and financial assistance programs available to students from different backgrounds and assist students in the application process for scholarships, including documentation and submission requirements. The cell offers support to both male and female students which is a positive step towards gender equity and inclusivity in higher education and in empowering students, especially women, to pursue higher education, thereby challenging societal norms and fostering gender empowerment.

7) Students' Legal Cell

The Students' Legal Cell in Vivekananda College aims to provide legal awareness and assistance to students, ensuring they understand their rights and responsibilities. Our

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alumni Advocate Mit Guha Roy is an active member of this cell and facilitates access to legal aid and representation for students in need. The cell actively works in creating a safe and supportive environment for students to seek legal assistance and advice and providing guidance on legal issues relevant to students, such as academic matters, harassment, and discrimination. Students' Legal Cell is equipped to address various gender-based issues faced by students, including sexual harassment, discrimination, and other forms of genderbased violence. Students' Legal Cell offers legal guidance and support to students, especially women, who may encounter challenges related to gender discrimination, harassment, or other legal matters.

The Teacher's Council awards special prizes to the top-performing students, recognizing academic excellence and achievements. The Sushama Mukhopadhyay Memorial Prize is conferred upon the highest-ranking female student, while the Dr. Sudhir Gopal Bandopadhyay Memorial Prize is presented to the male student who excels in the Department of Journalism.

Commitment of the Vivekananda College, Thakurpukur towards supporting work-life balance for all faculty members, irrespective of gender. Maternity, child care, and paternity leave granted to college teachers as a positive aspect of gender-sensitive policies and practices. This inclusionary approach ensures that both male and female teachers have access to leave benefits that cater to their family responsibilities, thereby fostering a more equitable and supportive work environment.

NCC UNIT:

The male and female cadets are involved in training exercises, and participate in community service projects specialized training programs, skill-building workshops, and educational initiatives. The NCC unit provides equal opportunities for both male and female cadets.

- Regular organization of additional sports programs.
- o Increasing awareness through more legal rights programs.
- o Implementing self-employment training across various subjects.
- o Enhancing the participation of a greater number of female students in EDC cell.
- o To improve the infrastructure of common rooms of male and female students.
- o Installation of additional sanitary napkin vending machines.
- o To establish a grievance redressal cell.
- Organize awareness programs on Legal Rights of Women.
- o Introduce self-employment training in different subjects.
- o Improve the marketability of the products made by students.
- o Organize more co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for students and staff including males and females.

CONCLUSION:

The Gender Audit Team observed that the college's top leadership publicly endorses gender integration and effectively communicates the organization's dedication to gender equity by allocating staff time and financial resources and implementing necessary policies and procedures. This demonstrates a genuine commitment to fostering gender equity within the institution. Additionally, the organizational culture within the college appears to be fairly balanced, characterized by a gender-diverse staff, a governance structure sensitive to gender issues, and an equal appreciation for the working styles of both men and women. However, there is a recognized need to enhance technical capacity by improving staff skills in gender analysis, adopting new systems for collecting gender-disaggregated data, and developing tools and procedures that are sensitive to gender considerations.









Adequate lighting is available in corridor, class rooms, common areas, toilets etc. 67 responses


Do you know college has CCTV surveillance 248 responses








