Hence our college opened this new and unique facility by building an artificial climbing wall. This facility was not available in the neighbourhood till now. One of the most successful performance of the institution was to commemorate the 200 birthday of the great bengali thinker, educationist and social reformer, Pandit Iswarchandra Vidyasagar. We received overwhelming response in this programme. As a part of this event, a group of enthusiastic students, teachers and staff visited the birthplace of Pandit Iswarchandra Vidyasagar to the village Birshingha. The members of the Students Union of our college organized an Awareness programme in collaboration with Kolkata Police in the tune of Safe Drive Save Life project of the State Government and distributed lots of helmets, free of cost, among the students. On the eve of Doljatra and Holi, a very colourful and cultured programme, Basantotsav, was framed in our college campus with the fraternization of all members of college family.

1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500

The institution remaining faithful to its name, believes in the harmonious development of body, mind and soul. Hence the institution whole heartedly encourages the student to take part actively in sports and games, cultural activities and social works apart from academic activities. In the beginning of every session, the college publishes an elaborate prospectus, comprising vision, mission and achievements of the institution. The prospectus is distributed to the students, teachers and the members of the non-teaching staff. This is how the communication begins. In the meetings of the Teachers' Council also every important aspect of the institution is discussed in detail. The resolutions of the meetings highlight the future course of action as far as teaching and learning are concerned. In the Teachers' Day (5th September) of every year, the Principal pays a visit to all the departments and explains the vision and mission of the institution. In the beginning of the academic sessions, the college publishes a routine, which indicates allotment of classes of each department. Primarily, the central routine is walled up in the college corridor and the same routine is displayed in the college web-site. Then the Convener, Academic Sub-Committee supplies the departmental routines to the departmental heads. Subsequently, the departmental heads allots the classes to his/her departmental colleagues. The routine is prepared in such a manner so that it enables a teacher to complete the curriculum within a specific period of time. If any discrepancy in the routine arises, then those are resolved by the Convener of Academic Sub-Committee in consultation with the Principal and the IQAC coordinator. Teachers of several departments sometimes take extra classes, in addition their regular classes, for completion of syllabus in time.
